

Lucynt Brings Interactive Play to UDS


UDS recently got a new technology upgrade! SociAbilities and CHAMPS recently had two **Lucynt Interactive Systems** installed within their program areas.

These fantastic devices hang from the wall or ceiling to create a fun and relaxing experience through visuals and sound. For example, folks can play a

rousing game of whack-a-mole by swatting at the moles as they appear on the projection.

With a focus on dementia, the Lucynt also aids our friends in CHAMPS who are beginning to exhibit symptoms of the disease. The device also helps promote physical fitness and activity, which has been shown to be worse in those with a cognitive impairment.
