Issue 17, supporting Summit DD, will appear on the ballot in Summit County in November. This is the first time in six years that voters are asked to approve a levy to renew this vital financial support for citizens with developmental disabilities.

Summit County Developmental Disabilities Board is one of the most essential points of connectivity between UDS and the individuals we serve. They provide a large share of the funding for programs that support more than 5,000 children and adults with disabilities in Summit County. They link individuals to programs and providers, and also help to assure safe and healthy conditions and practices.

With your "YES" vote, UDS will continue to provide day programs and transportation to well over 200 adults. We will continue to provide recreational sports to more than

400 youth and adults. We will continue to reach scores of children, from newborns on up, through the Toy & Resource Center. The individuals we serve will continue to explore activities throughout the community, make friends, share experiences and possibly volunteer or prepare for a job in the community. 
